Priscilla Rasmussen 🛵

For so many of us, owning our own business and being "the boss" was a dream that never materialized, but for 18-year Saw Creek resident Priscilla Rasmussen the dream came true as a second career, and now she owns ARCS- Academic and Research Conference Services.

Priscilla's first career took place mainly at Rutgers University in NJ. Over the 25 years she was there, she worked her way up in the Computer Science Dept. and wound up managing the laboratory for Computer Science Research with grants worth between \$2-5 million per year and the teaching department with a \$10 million



budget. "On the side," Priscilla worked with many faculty members organizing conferences locally and nationally. In 1983 she connected with an international conference, and that is where her interest in coordinating conferences on a more regular basis began.

Fortunate to take an early but full retirement, Priscilla started her business here in the Poconos after she moved to Saw Creek. Basically, ARCS organizes conferences internationally for "not for profit" research societies and acts as a business manager for one society that has about 1,500 members. She also plans and organizes smaller conferences and at times mentors PhD students so they can attend conferences around the world. She loves to watch them "grow up" and proud to see them become senior scientists in Natural Language Processing, R&D, and Bullying or Terrorism Online Language Detection and Control.

Priscilla gets to travel all over the world (Singapore, Australia, Lisbon, Ukraine, Argentina, etc.) but for her the most exciting part of her job is working with groups of people (locals) internationally and developing friendships, immersing herself in their cultures, and "broadening my perspective of the world"; "it is truly a privilege to do this work."

She is very proud of developing relationships with major companies such as Google, Amazon, IBM, Microsoft and several others which have become featured sponsors and exhibitors at her conferences, but she is most proud of being able to "after two years of negotiating, planning, preparing, and eventually setting up the catering, audio-visual, and physical arrangements at the hotel or convention center, watch 3,000 attendees meet each other, mingle, present their work, and enjoy the conference overall."

So, what could possibly be a negative to this dream job? Priscilla says the biggest problem is sometimes being overwhelmed with organizing a conference from a distance - responsible for the success but not on site for the planning stages. Fortunately, she has been able to employ four Saw Creek residents over the years to help her succeed, but she says that a long time ago at Rutgers she learned to "do what was asked of you, learn from others, and don't give into your self-doubt. Take on the challenge and you will find a way to make it work."

When not traveling or at the office, Priscilla tries to stay busy here in Saw Creek. In the past, she has served on two ad-hoc committees and has been a member of the Saw Creek Women's Club for seven years, where she now serves as a VP and plans outings and trips! She also likes to stay home with her constant companion, her dog Mr. Pickles (who often travels with her) and her cat and listen to jazz, a passion of hers since she was very young.

Priscilla loves her home, she loves living in Saw Creek, and we love having her as a resident who can show us to follow our dreams.



I'm pleased to report that unaudited financial results indicate that we finished 2019 slightly under budget despite several unanticipated expenses throughout the year. Many thanks to the management team for keeping discretionary spending under control and turning a potential deficit into a modest surplus.



As many of you know by now, the 2020 budget included funding to keep the Mill Pond indoor pool open during the winter and there's more to watch for in the coming year. The Mill Pond boats and docks will be expanded and improved; the Top of the World indoor pool and fitness center will get some HVAC upgrades; an emergency generator will be installed to support the new Mill Pond mail pavilion and compactors; a recycling and bulk waste facility will become operational; and a new snow-making pump system and ski lift chairs will be installed.

And speaking of the ski lift, whether you are a skier or not, I'd like to remind you that another fun-filled winter season is well underway thanks to favorable weather, new snow making equipment and a new groomer. Our annual President's Week and Winterfest celebrations are just around the corner. Shopping Online Safely

Merchants are making online shopping increasingly convenient by accepting not just credit cards, but debit 💦 cards and checks. However, according to the Privacy Rights Clearinghouse (PRC), the safest way to shop online is with a credit card. If something goes wrong, you're protected under the federal Fair Credit Billing Act.

Here are other online shopping tips from PRC:


- Use one credit card exclusively for all your online shopping. This makes it easier to spot unauthorized charges.
- Don't pay for online purchases with a check, since checks are vulnerable to bank fraud. Even mailing a check or money order won't give you any protection if you have problems with the purchase.
- Use a true credit card—not a debit card, check card or an ATM card. A debit card exposes your bank account to thieves. Your checking account could be wiped out in minutes. Also, federal law does not protect debit and ATM cards as extensively as it does credit cards.
- Use a "virtual credit card," if possible. Some banks are now offering their credit card customers a free service called single-use card numbers. Virtual credit cards use a randomly generated, substitute account number so you never need to give out your real credit card number online, over the phone or through the mail.

Among the card companies offering a virtual credit card service are Citibank, who calls its program Virtual Account Number and Discover calls its service Secure Online Account Number. You specify the expiration date and credit limit. Once used, the card is tied to the merchant where it was used, and cannot be used elsewhere. If you don't have Discover or Bank of America credit cards, check with your credit card company to see if they offer a similar service.

As technology advances, so does criminal activity. Stay safe out there in cyber world.

Recycling Now Available

Saw Creek is pleased to announce that we are launching a community-wide recycling program. We are counting on you to get this new program off to a good start! Recycling paper, cardboard, plastic, cans and glass from your household will help reduce the amount of things thrown away as garbage and is an important and simple step to building a greener community.

Saw Creek will offer this service to residents during the same hours of operation and location as our bi-monthly Bulk Dumping Program. The recycling container(s) are located on Decker Road next to our garbage containers in the bulk dumping area.

Mark your calendar for the next couple of months for the dates these services will be available:

Feb 8 / Feb 22 / March 14 / March 28 - 9:00am to 12:00pm

While an attendant will be available for assistance, the recycling containers are marked with a sticker that explains what you may place in the recycling bins. To make it easier for you to participate in the recycling program, here are the three simple rules:



What needs to be separated?

cardboard

The only thing you need to separate is paper products (paper, cardboard,



magazines) from the rest of your recyclables. Bring your recyclables in your own containers separate from your garbage.

Other best practices can be found on the Waste Management website at RecycleOftenRecycleRight.com (or go to any search engine and type in the words recycle right recycle often).

This is a temporary solution to meet the township's requirement. In the spring of 2020 we plan to have a permanent facility set up at the former stables site on Decker Road. It will be single stream, meaning all in one dumpster and we will discuss having it open more hours and alternate days.

RCR 2019-10: Added the permission to fish in Mill Pond: Section: V. Pets, Wildlife & the Environment, Rule C.

RCR 2019-12: The presence of an adult is mandatory when burning fires in an approved fire pit: Section: IV. Health & Safety, Rule C.

RCR 2019-13: Removed bullet point D4 from Section: III. Community Roadways & Parking Areas, Rule D4.

RCR 2019-14: Added the removed text as indicated on RCR 2019-13 to the Rule Making Authority paragraph on page 3 of the Rules Document.

RCR 2019-15: This change provides clarification that tailgating/piggybacking are a violation of the Gate Card rule: Section II. Community Identification Procedures, Rule B.

RCR 2019-16: Lowered the fine amount from Tier 3 to Tier 2: Section V. Pets, Wildlife & the Environment, Rule A6.

RCR 2019-17: Added oversized beach ball to the list of items that are not permitted in the pools: Section VII. Community Facilities and Amenities, Rule B10.

RCR 2019-19: Added the permission to ice skate on the VIP Pond: Section VII. Community Facilities and Amenities, Rule A8.



- 1 bay leaf

- ¼ cup country-style or Dijon mustard

The Safety Spot Family & Home Safety

Although we live in a somewhat secure and safe community environment here at Saw Creek Estates (SCE), we often experience environmental emergencies, such as snowstorms, road closures, as well as power outages. Additionally, there are some unsavory individuals in our community who look for opportunities to take advantage of our relaxed attitude regarding our safety and well-



being. Securing our family and home is very important and should be a top priority. There are several ways in which we can be proactive in securing our family and our homes during emergencies and from intruders.

A household emergency plan should be implemented addressing what to do in case of a fire, illness, weather emergency, and an explanation for the operation of the security system if there is one. Where do we meet in case we are separated during a storm or blackout? What type of emergency provisions should we have in our vehicles, in our physical possession, and/or in our home, besides water? Finally, how do we secure our family members and/or home on a day to day basis when we are in residence or away? These are the types of things we should discuss with our family members, and consider in the New Year, if we haven't already.

Children should know their first and last names, as well as their parents' names, and should memorize their telephone number and address including city and state, so that they can respond to emergency personnel if they are lost or separated from you. They should know when and how to dial 9-1-1 for help during any emergency. When out of the house we should have some form of reflective device with us, as weather changes rapidly and darkness can be upon us very quickly.

Securing your home is another priority item. Be sure to keep ladders

folded and put away. Never leave them open against the house. Keep sliding deck doors secured with metal or wood rods so they cannot be forced open. When economically feasible purchase a security system. They range from \$15 a month and up, and some have no installation cost with contract. Some include video surveillance; glass break sensors; motion detectors for doors and windows; and smoke and carbon dioxide detectors. Also, alert a trusted neighbor when you will be away so that they can keep an eye on your home, and report any suspicious activity.

Have a happy, blessed and safe 2020!

Final Suggestions:

- Secure your crawl space and check it periodically.
- Make sure your family members know where the circuit breaker and water cutoff valve is located.
- Purchase a fire extinguisher for each floor in your home, make sure every family member knows how to use them, and have them checked by an extinguisher service company i.e., "Cintas" <u>https://</u><u>www.cintas.com/location-finder/</u> or go to any search engine and type in the words Cintas fire safety
- Take a first aid and CPR class if possible. For information concerning both contact the American Red Cross at <u>www.redcross.org</u>, call them at 800-733-2767 or go to any search engine and type in the words American Red Cross.
- Keep important documents in a waterproof pouch, in a fireproof safe, including front and back copies of your license, credit and bank cards.
- Your family should have two emergency meeting locations in case you cannot return to your home. One location close to home as well as another central location. Decide on one out of town family member that should be called in case you are separated from one another during a local emergency or unexpected evacuation.
- Do not store propane tanks or gas storage containers in your house or garage. Store them under your deck out of the sun or in your shed away from your house. Plastic sheds are great for propane tanks, gas containers as well as small yard tools.

Lehman Township Amends Short-Term Rental Ordinance

Last year's Pennsylvania (PA) Supreme Court's decision addressing the permissibility of short-term rentals (STRs) in residential zoning districts has had a statewide impact on the home share economy¹. Based on that ruling, Lehman Township amended their existing STR ordinance. The Public Information Committee (PIC) met with Lehman Township's Supervisor Rob Rohner to talk about the amended ordinance and how it affects all township residents, including Saw Creek homeowners.

PIC: Let's start with a bit of history. In 2018, the supervisors passed short-term rental ordinance # 135. Was there an event or events that precipitated the decision to create this ordinance?

Mr. Rohner: In April 2017, a deck at a rental home in Saw Creek collapsed, seriously injuring the renters, all of whom were minors under 21 years of age². Since township supervisors are obligated to protect the public health, safety and welfare of its residents and visitors, we initiated a STR rental ordinance. Township residents with an interest in STRs attended the first township meeting on this issue in August 2018. All homeowner comments at the meeting, for or against, were considered. Ultimately the township's STR rental ordinance passed in October 2018.

PIC: After the ordinance passed, did township residents comply with the process of getting a permit?

Mr. Rohner: The applications for a rental permit started to pour in. A two-year permit costs \$150; \$47 of that figure was allotted to the building inspector, making the township's share \$103. Our focus is both on safety and regulation, so it's interesting that of the approximately 40 applications that first were received, only one of them passed inspection. Items such as no smoke detectors, handrails, etc., caused the failed home inspections, which had to be corrected before a permit could be issued.

PIC: About one year after the initial ordinance was passed, the aforementioned PA Supreme Court ruling was issued. Based on that ruling, Lehman Township amended the STR ordinance effective December 2019. Would you elaborate on the changes in the updated ordinance?

Mr. Rohner: The township's amended rental ordinance now re-categorizes STRs in two ways:

- Short term home rentals: the homeowner must live in the home at least 183 days per year.
- Short term transient rentals: the home was purchased for investment purposes only. There is no residency requirement for this type of rental, but the homeowner must submit an application for a conditional use permit. Upon submission of the application and a fee of \$350.00, a hearing will be scheduled with the township supervisors. The supervisors will notify neighbors near the home for the scheduled meeting, and neighbors are encouraged to attend to voice their objections, if any. A hearing notice is placed in local newspapers, once a week for two weeks, and the zoning officer also posts a visible notice on the property about the hearing.

PIC: After the supervisors weigh all the information presented at the hearing, what comes next?

Mr. Rohner: If the conditional use application is approved, the homeowner then applies for a permit to rent the home. Homeowners can use this link on our website to apply: https://safe.hostcompliance.com/lehman-township-pa/permit-registration/welcome.³ If the application is not approved, the homeowner is sent a denial letter, who may then file an appeal with the Pike County Court of Common Pleas.

PIC: What is being done to confirm that township homeowners who rent STRs are complying with the ordinance?

Mr. Rohner: In addition to providing a link to apply for a rental permit or make a complaint about a rental home, we use the same company, Home Compliance, to scour the web on a daily basis to look for rental ads, which helps us confirm if the homeowner is in compliance or not with the permit process.

PIC: Thank you, Mr. Rohner for providing more insight on the township's amended STR rental ordinance.
